Monthly Report – January 2009

Overview of Activities

- The Department of Pupil Personnel Services is responsible for the following activities throughout the month of January: Update all staffing caseloads, Prepare budget, Examine in detail program reviews of our Early Learning Center and Transition Services, Contact early intervention on students/Outreach to other state agencies, Professional Development/Implementation, Meet with Key Constituents regarding implementation of school improvement and system wide goals, Walkthrough of Buildings, Complete Medicaid RMTS Reports, and Advertise and promote outreach to the community of Uxbridge, Massachusetts.

Subject Activities

Throughout the month of January, the Director of Pupil Personnel Services met with Uxbridge Public School service providers in the areas of special education, English language education, 504 compliance, and guidance/wellness. Additionally, the Director of Pupil Personnel Services met with representative of MSB-Services, Inc. and CaseE, Inc, its IEP software provider, in an effort to effectively improve the software platform for the Uxbridge Public Schools administration, faculty, staff and service providers.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services attended out-of-district IEP meetings in the following communities: Attleboro, Douglas, Plainville, North Attleboro, Millbury, West Boylston, and Worcester, Massachusetts.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to examine the special education budget on a monthly basis - in cooperation with the School Business Manager, and Superintendent of Schools.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to be an active member of the Administrative Team meeting process twice per month. As well, the Director participates on the Uxbridge Interagency Roundtable, Gifted and Talented Education Team, Response to Intervention (Rti) Implementation Team, and the Uxbridge Public Schools Technology Team.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to work in partnership with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Department of Elementary and Secondary Education in the area of grant writing as a means of improving programs and services for students with disabilities.

During the months of December and January, the Director of Pupil Personnel Service is conducting a series of program reviews in the areas of Speech and Language Pathology as well as in the area of autism. Progress reports, preliminary reports and follow up materials/findings will be submitted to the Superintendent of Schools throughout this process.

On January 14, 2009, the Department of Pupil Personnel Services held a “Family Night” for parents and students currently enrolled in our English as a Second Language (ESL) program. The goal of the evening was to educate parents and students on initiative currently underway this academic year; and to inform everyone of our upcoming ESL Adult Education Classes, which are forming now for a February start date. The ESL Adult Education Classes will run for eight weeks throughout the months of February, March and April for those parents and families interested in learning English as a Second Language.

Professional Development Activities

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to offer department support in the areas of relicensure guidance/technical support – so that Uxbridge Public Schools special education faculty/staff remain current in the ever-changing laws of the Commonwealth. This technical support and guidance is offered throughout the academic year in partnership with the Department of Education and Framingham State College.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to be an active member of the English Language Learners Low Incidence Group and the Blackstone Valley Educational Collaborative Regional monthly meeting – as a means of remaining current with local, state and federal legal mandates.

On January 16, 2009, MSB-Services sent CaseE 2.0 trainers to Uxbridge, MA. in an effort to provide professional development to our entire special education administration, faculty and staff on how to operate the latest version of the IEP software platform. The latest 2.0 version will be online January 27, 2009.

The LSDO plans to sponsor another FREE professional development opportunity to local school districts in Central Massachusetts on “Co-Teaching with Purpose: Strategies for Student Success!” The course will be taught by the Director of Pupil Personnel Services and attended by more than 30 educators from around the region – including three or more from the Uxbridge Public Schools.
