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Monthly Report – March 2010

Overview of Activities

- The Department of Pupil Personnel Services is responsible for the following activities throughout the month of February: Update all staffing caseloads, Meet Evaluation Timelines, Finalize budget processes for public hearing, Conduct early childhood screening, Professional development/implementation, Meet with key constituents regarding implementation of school improvement and system wide goals, Walkthrough of buildings, Conduct resolution, facilitation, mediation, and hearing Processes, Plan extended year programs, Complete Medicaid RMTS Reports, Implement MCAS Supports for Assessment, Prepare Yearly Reports, Submit SIMS, and Advertise and promote outreach to the community of Uxbridge, Massachusetts.
- ESL Adult Education Classes have begun. The classes are held twice per week throughout the months of February, March and April for those parents and families interested in learning English as a Second Language.

Subject Activities

Throughout the month of March, the Director of Pupil Personnel Services met with Uxbridge Public School service providers in the areas of special education, English language education, 504 compliance, Guidance Services, and Health/Wellness.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services attended out-of-district IEP meetings in the following communities: Bellingham, Blackstone, Framingham, Natick, North Attleboro, Plainville, and Worcester, Massachusetts.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to examine the special education budget on a monthly basis - in cooperation with the School Business Manager and Superintendent of Schools.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to be an active member of the Administrative Team meeting process twice per month. As well, the Director participates on the Uxbridge Response to Intervention (Rti) Implementation Team, and the Uxbridge Public Schools Technology Team.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to work in partnership with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Department of Elementary and Secondary Education in the area of grant writing as a means of improving programs and services for students with disabilities.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Service has concluded a series of program reviews in the areas of Speech and Language Pathology as well as in the area of autism. Progress reports, preliminary reports and follow up materials/findings have been submitted to the Superintendent of Schools throughout this process.

The ESL Adult Education Classes have begun. The classes are held twice per week throughout the months of February, March and April for those parents and families interested in learning English as a Second Language.

Professional Development Activities

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to offer department support in the areas of relicensure guidance/technical support – so that Uxbridge Public Schools special education faculty/staff remain current in the ever-changing laws of the Commonwealth. This technical support and guidance is offered throughout the academic year in partnership with the Department of Education and Framingham State College.

The Director of Pupil Personnel Services continues to be an active member of monthly regional meetings. Each month, the Director attends the LSDO Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment Team, the English Language Learners Low Incidence Group and the Blackstone Valley Educational Collaborative – as a means of remaining current with local, state and federal legal mandates.

On March 23rd & 24th, the Director of Pupil Personnel Services participated in a DESE grant funded initiative on improving special education program and service delivery for all Local Education Agencies throughout the Commonwealth. Some thirty five districts from all corners of the Commonwealth participated in this opportunity.

PAC Reports

On March 10, 2010, the Uxbridge Special Education Parent Advisory Council (USEPAC) held its seventh meeting of the 2009-2010 academic year at 7:00p.m. in the library of the Whittin Middle School.


