Principal's Piece:

April has come and gone...May is just about finished...and June is staring us right in the face! How fast this school year has gone by and how excited I am to continue to see strong student and faculty leadership and commitment to Uxbridge High School! *Thank you* to senior Jackie Gianetti, junior Tara Feeley and sophomore Dan Penza for their participation as actors and to the Uxbridge Police Department and Fire Departments for their cooperation in and participation of a reenactment of a mock car crash scene sponsored by SADD and advisor Amanda Alsfeld. They were chaperoned by English teacher and Class of 2013 Advisor Amy Desilets and Social Studies teacher Lauren Bouchard. *Seniors* Katelyn Dionne and Dana Renault attended the Mass Forum Training in Taunton with Adjustment Counselor Alison Dwyer. This training is in support of The Coalition for a Community of Caring (formerly known as The Blackstone Valley Youth Coalition). And, *congratulations* to Physical Education teacher and track coach, Walter Berkowicz for being named the Central Mass Girls Indoor Track Coach of the year awarded by the Mass State Track Coaches Association. As we complete the final trimester of the year, so comes the time for *Advanced Placement Tests* for many of our upperclassmen. Over 90 students took exams in May in the following AP Courses: Government, French, Spanish, Calculus, English Literature, US History, Biology, Chemistry and English Language. *Thank you* to guidance counselor Brian Burke for organizing the exams. I thank the Uxbridge community for their continued support of the students in Uxbridge.

History

On April 9th, Mrs. Puckett took two of her students to Student Government Day at the State House in Boston. Peter Mannka, a senior, was elected by the UHS student body to serve as delegate and Andie Hession, also a senior, was alternate. The keynote speaker for the event was Attorney General Martha Coakley. The students debate two bills: cell phone use while driving, and earlier starting time for high school students. The debate was vigorous and demonstrated a serious interest on the part of the student delegates. Schools from all over the state participated in this event.

Technology

Students are working on Electricity Unit, Waves, and Communications in 9th grade Physics/Technology. In support of alcohol awareness month, students are working on videos related to alcohol awareness in Photo/Video. Students continue building various desks, tables, bookshelves, and wall units for the new Video Production room in construction. Also, students continue work on designing and building new picnic tables for Pout Pond.

Science

Students are using the Engineering Design Method to produce a working trebuchet in pre-engineering while students in horticulture work on grafting various trees and shrubs. Energy/Energy pyramids and the food chain food web are being discussed in Honors Biology. Forensics is focusing on arson and a fingerprint lab.

Family and Consumer Science

Mrs. Jane Archibald of Unibank for Savings visited Mrs. Plasse's Independent Living classes to talk about banking, the importance of maintaining good credit and general financial literacy. Interior Design classes have appreciated the beautiful design of homes close to the high school by taking walking tours to identify various architectural features. Mrs. Priore's Foods classes participated in a community service learning opportunity by preparing soup and cookies for the Empty Bowl fundraiser which aided the People First Food Pantry. Mr. Douglas Priore visited the Foods classes to explain and demonstrate the Passover Seder and how food is central to the celebration of this holiday and how it relates to the Christian observance of Easter. He shared a power point based on the two years he lived in this land of culture, history and controversy.

Prevocational Skills

Spring is here! Our class has been outside for fresh air and exercise as often as the good weather permits. We are planning some local walking field trips into the community and in house at UHS. We intend to get out into the community at least once weekly. We will use these community field trips to assess students' growth this year in the areas of comparison shopping, making purchases, counting bills and coins, ordering from menus, improving social etiquette, tipping, and to practice community safety. We are scheduling some in house field trips which will take place on the UHS campus where progress in such areas as meal preparation, cafe' maintenance and kitchen safety will be assessed. We also plan to utilize the outdoors to further develop, practice, and reinforce physical skills.

In Social Studies, we have been focusing on major events occurring during the 20th Century. Mr. Sweeney recently lectured as a guest speaker on his experience in the Vietnam War. As always, his presentation was very informative and riveting. In addition to the historical aspects of Mr. Sweeney's experiences, the students learned much about the climate and landscape of Southeast Asia. Ms. Hamelin and the students continue to work hard with recycling efforts. The students are dedicated to the job and even some of our students who are less social are really enjoying the work and are benefitting from the interaction with staff and students throughout UHS.
